Narrative

The overall occupancy for the month of January 2017 was 80% with Intensive Care at 83.6%. High Dependency at 73.7% and Low Dependency at 82.6%. There was an increase in sickness rates with 148 shifts lost to direct pateint care and staff continue to work flexibly to meet the needs of the service. 4 Intensive care cots were closed for 3 days due to an Estates lissue which as now been resolved and in total the unit was closed to admisisons on 17 shifts - 14 of these due to activity.
