

Narrative

The overall occupancy for the month of September 2017 was 90.7% with Intensive Care at 103.8%, High Dependency at 100% and Low Dependency at 77%. The unit was closed to admissions on 36 shifts due to activity - none due to staffing issues. All planned new starters have commenced in post and are supported on the Induction programme. Sickness absence has reduced this month to 4.07% and is being managed with support from the HR advisors
