Narrative

The overall occupancy for the month December 2017 was 86.5% with Intensive Care at 54.35%, High Dependency at 107.3% and Low Dependency at 114.7%. The unit was closed to admissions on 4 shifts due to activity not due to any staffing issues. Sickness decreased in month to 4.6% with 71% of that due to long term sickness. All are being managed with support from HR advisors. Recruitment for experienced Neonatal staff did not result in any appointments and a further recruitment for staff with out experience is planned for January 2018.
