



The staffing ratio during the day is 1:9. during the month of April the nurse to patient ration did exceed this number and on occasion was 1:10. There is a Band 6 Team Leader identified Monday to Friday who clinically supports the team and co-ordinates patient flow. Due to sickness in April it was not possible for the team leader to remain supernumery and had to take a team of patients to ensure safe staffing levels. when this occurred the ward manager co-ordinated patient flow. when these red flag incidents occurred the matron and Duty Manager were informed.
