


Staffing Report - Neonatal Care August 2018 Last updated: 07/09/2018







The overall occupancy for the month of August 2018 was 81.7% with Intensive Care 89%, High Dependency 99.2% and Low Dependency 65.6%. There were 2 staffing breaches in month due to last minute sickness and this is the first time in 15 months this has occurred. Further recruitment for Band 5 & 3 staff is in progress. There is also Band 6 internal recruitment to replace those staff who were successful in their Trainee ANNP interviews.
