

Reading to Bump

We're looking to recruit enthusiastic and committed volunteers to support our Reading to Bump programme which runs for a couple of hours on alternate Fridays in the Parent Education Class. Ante Natal Clinic.

The session is for new and expectant parents to experience communicating with their new and unborn children through a variety of reading material – books, newspapers, leaflets, social media – anything to stimulate communication between parent/guardian and child. We will also offer as part of this drop in service, the ability to refer to a midwife for advice and support, including safeguarding and Early Help (EHAT) from our safeguarding, and enhanced community midwifery team.

The volunteer role involves:

- Preparing the room
- Provide support to parents with talking and sharing literacy to unborn and newborn babies
- Explain the benefits of reading to bump
- Give out BookStart packs and offer registration for babies first library card.
- Serve Refreshments
- Read/rhyme and involve older siblings

ATTENDANCE



Volunteering positions in the wards and clinics are very sought after and in high demand!

During 2018 the volunteers' average weekly attendance was 58%. This means that on average volunteers failed to turn up to almost 40% of volunteer shifts that had been committed to.

This low level of attendance leaves a significant shortage of volunteer support. To help alleviate this shortfall, from April 2019 we will monitor attendance more closely and only offer clinical area volunteer roles to those volunteers who are able to demonstrate a good level of reliability.

If your current commitments/circumstances don't allow you to attend regularly we would like to continue to support you, but in the Meet and Greet role which has a great deal more flexibility, with the intention of you returning to a clinical area as soon as you are able to.

Finally I would just like to say thank you to our many volunteers who provide an excellent level of attendance – your continued support and commitment is much appreciated.

Trust News

Neonatal Project - Update

We would like to take this opportunity to update staff on the progress of the Neonatal redevelopment project, particularly in relation to the external works now actively being progressed.



Staff will have noticed the creation of the *Interserve* compound and the temporary changes made to the road layout around the site.

Within the compound area a significant amount of excavation and building work is now taking place - interestingly, we have reached the basement of the houses that were previously on this site.

These works will be followed by the building of foundations on which to hold the new Neonatal intensive care pods around the outside of the building and linked to the present Neonatal Unit. The image below shows how the pods will be positioned onto the existing unit.

For health and safety reasons during these works the contractors have installed boards on the windows on the ground floor within the area of the compound which will provide protection to our staff, patients and visitors using these rooms from potential debris and fire.

In partnership with our contractors we are considering ways to improve the working environment during these works which include, for example, improved lighting, ventilation and some portable air conditioning units. Work will commence in these rooms this week.

We appreciate the patience and cooperation of staff in these rooms and we aim to have improved working conditions restored within the next few weeks
