What is Liverpool Centre for Genomic Medicine?

Liverpool Centre for Genomic Medicine (LCGM) is the regional genetics service serving the Cheshire and Merseyside region, and the Isle of Man.

Where is LCGM located?

LCGM is based at Liverpool Women's Hospital, although we have clinics across a number of areas including Chester, Wirral, Crewe, Ormskirk, and Warrington.

Members of our team also participate in specialised clinics across various hospitals including at The Walton Centre, Liverpool Heart and Chest Hospital and Alder Hey Children's Hospital.

What do you do at LCGM?

We see adults, children, and their families, for a number of reasons. There may be a genetic diagnosis in the family, or suspicion of a genetic condition.

We also see patients with a personal or family history of cancer, and pregnant people who have a chance of having a baby with a genetic condition.

We may be able to offer genetic testing, information about the genetic condition, discuss the chance of having a genetic condition and organise appropriate screening recommendations. Not everyone who attends an appointment at LCGM will have a genetic test.

Who should be seen by LCGM?

People with a confirmed or suspected personal or family history of a genetic condition and people with a personal or family history of cancer may be eligible to be seen in genetics.

If you think you or your family should be seen in Genetics, please discuss this with your GP or any of the healthcare professionals looking after you.
